We have had a brilliant week of learning in Cedar Class this week. The children have shown great perseverance and this has allowed us to have a productive week together. We have really enjoyed continuing to get to know the children and the parents of Cedar Class. It is great to get the opportunity to share the progress of the children with you and we would like to thank you for your ongoing support as we continue to do this.

In writing we have begun to use a shared text, 'The Boy at the Back of the Class', to support us in developing our writing skills. On Monday, we made predictions about the story and we cannot wait to find out if our predictions were correct! Our class novel has helped us with our learning about verbs and adverbs in a sentence this week. The children enjoyed acting out the verbs and applying their learning in their writing. In maths the children have demonstrated their mathematical thinking through representing numbers. We have used resources to represent numbers and to begin to solve problems using our learning.

In reading and phonics this week, the children have discussed the unusual vocabulary which we have identified in our texts. We have had shared discussions about the texts and this has supported us with developing our comprehension skills further. In story time, we have continued to read our new class novel 'The Boy at the back of the Class' which we are really enjoying! Please continue reading at home as a family, we love hearing about it. Accelerated Reader books will go home with the children and Bug Club phonics books will be allocated as E-Books for you to access online. The children can complete their quizzes online after they finish their book and then collect a new book at school. Please let us know if you have any issues with this.
