Dear Parents

We have had a busy week in Oak class! We have really enjoyed all of our learning, with lots of opportunities to work together in groups and explore different resources to further our learning and understanding.

In English we have been researching recount texts and learning how to write them. We have read some examples of recount texts, discussing what has been done well and how they could be improved. We have identified the different features of these texts and have been developing these skills in our own writing. In Maths we have begun our new unit of learning which is focused around the four operations. We have started the unit with exploring addition, practising this skill and applying it to reasoning problems to deepen our understanding.

As Historians we have been analysing artefacts from the Vikings and Anglo-Saxons. By examining them we have gained an insight into what life was like then and what was important to the people of this time. Through our unit of work in RE we have been exploring the link between the Creation story and Science. This week we have been examining artwork that represents the Creation story, discussing how the artwork captures the story and asking questions that have been raised through both the story and the artwork.

In RHE we have continued exploring respect through the book 'Have you filled my bucket?' by Carol McCloud. The book encourages positive behaviour and shows us how easy and rewarding it is to express kindness, appreciation and respect.
