Dear Parents

We have had another busy week in Oak Class. We have continued with our new units of learning in maths, history, science and RE and began our new unit of dance in PE with Mr Kirk.

In English we have continued with our sentence stacking lessons, developing our writing skills so that we can complete a persuasive independent write next week. In Maths we have used our skill of finding equivalent fractions to order and compare fractions. We also learnt how to convert mixed numbers to improper fractions and convert improper fractions to mixed numbers.

As historians we have continued our exploration of the Second World War by learning about the allies and the axis. We used our map skills from geography to locate and identify the different countries involved in the war. We also began to think about the reasons that Germany attacked Britain. In RE we continued learning about the Hindu religion by exploring what 'atman' is to Hindus. We looked at a Hindu story called 'The man in the well' to help with our understanding of this concept.

Homework this week is grammar, reading and TT Rockstars. There is a grammar sheet on Google Classroom to be completed by Monday. For reading all children have reading range and should have a book that is in this range so that they can read it and complete a quiz on the Accelerated Reader website.
