We have put up our bird hide, which has allowed us to observe the different birds who visit our outside space. The children have been using magnifying glasses, binoculars, note pads, mark making tools and a winter bird hunt checklist to explore their surroundings outside.

Also, this week we have been investigating and describing the signs of winter, such as frost on surfaces, ice or being able to see our breath. We have been making ice outside freezing water with pinecones and feathers. and we have frozen the dinosaurs in our dino world.

It has been a challenging week in Oak class with children either being absent or being in school and not feeling 100% well. They have all worked incredibly hard despite this and have made good progress in all their learning. In Maths the children continued with their unit on fractions and explored ways to convert improper fractions to mixed numbers, and mixed numbers to improper fractions. They have used pictorial representations to either support their learning or to prove their mathematical thinking.

In History, the children have been exploring how women got the vote. This week they began learning about the suffragists and the suffragettes and some of the key women who led the movement. In Science, the children continued their learning on classification by creating classification keys for sweets and then for the whole class. The children will use this learning next week when they apply it to classifying different species of animals.

Oak class will continue to attend Forest School every Thursday. Please ensure that they have suitable warm, outdoor clothing to enable them to enjoy the sessions fully. A pair of waterproof trousers, a waterproof coat and a pair of wellington boots would be ideal in this wet and cold weather. Hats, scarfs and gloves would also be a good idea.

Please encourage your child to read every evening and to complete one of their comprehension activities. All children know how to do this and are very capable of completing independently. It would also be good to allow your child to access TT Rock Stars regularly. We are currently focusing on the 8 times table multiplication and division facts.
