Stronger together

What a lovely week we have had at the academy. The teaching staff have been visiting our LAP schools as they complete their National Professional Qualifications, working alongside Trust colleagues. It was an absolute pleasure to get back into the classroom with Cedars, who were very patient with me. It is amazing to see what they complete in a day and how hard they work. I know lots of them have come in not feeling 100% too, so we are handing out as much TLC as we can to get them through.

We also completed a range of assessments this week, and pupils have worked very hard to do their best, displaying an amazing growth mindset by having a go and not feeling stressed while doing them. This is a significant skill in itself. Thanks for all the support in speedy sounds and regular reading you are doing at home; it is making a huge difference, with many pupils making amazing progress.

A sense of belonging

Thank you all for your respectful and thought-provoking emails regarding our attendance reward. They were certainly received in the way you intended them, and we are a listening school. We believe you and your children are correct in pointing out the challenges, which we had not fully considered.

This week, I spoke with the school council and then with pupils in assembly to explore what we could do to ensure everyone feels valued for what they can control. The children suggested that receiving a sticker or certificate and competing for the 100% class cup would be acceptable for attendance. Children are currently voting on whether they would prefer non-uniform days linked to reading every night instead of something they cannot control, such as illness. We believe that some rules need to be attached to this, such as requiring parents or carers to sign off on the reading record. We understand that sometimes the family may have a special occasion or it was a very busy night, so the reading didn't happen. This is not a problem, but please let us know; we are happy to allow for some 'wiggle' room to support families.

Please share your thoughts on this; we like the children's idea, as it is something within their control. If their reading improves over the term, a non-uniform day will be the reward. We explained that this is the only homework we assign and is valuable preparation for transitions.

Spring is here!

Understanding the World

In Maples, we have been talking about the changes that happen from winter to spring and discussing how the children themselves have changed since they were babies. Also, we have been comparing baby animals – lambs to sheep, chicks to chickens.

We have been on a walk around the school, exploring the signs of spring, observing how fast plants are sprouting and shooting up, and how the trees have buds and blossoms on them too. As we have been exploring, we have talked about caring for the natural world and some of the things we can do to look after our environment, such as putting litter in the bin, putting food out for the birds, and putting our snack fruit waste into the compost bin.

Music - Expressive Arts and Design

We have been listening to the first movement of 'Spring' from the 'Four Seasons' by Antonio Vivaldi, which starts with birdsong and ends with a sudden Spring storm. The children have been encouraged to listen and talk about the music, expressing their feelings and responses.

Maple children have been practicing for their music performance. Using shakers, we have been thinking about rhythms and beats, quiet and loud, and 'rest,' which means STOP!

Next week, we will be celebrating Easter with some fun activities and stories.

It has been a wonderful week in Oak class with the children working hard in all their lessons.

In Maths, the children have begun practising their 9 times table multiplication and division facts and are already demonstrating fluent recall of these.
