

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We are loving learning about Space! Many of the children can now talk about the different planets in our Solar System. This week, we've enjoyed listening to The Planets by Gustav Holst and have been practicing our cutting and sticking skills by creating rocket pictures. Next week, we'll be exploring the moon!

In Reception, children are continuing to learn new sounds. This week, we focused on 'sh' and 'th,' while also recapping previously learned sounds. We had so much fun practicing our counting by singing the song Five Little Men in a Flying Saucer.


Mondays & Wednesdays: PE kits should be in school during the week and not worn to school on any day.

In Kingfishers, we have finished looking at shape for now. We are starting to think more about place value, with two-digit numbers. We are counting up in ones and tens and talking about 'teen' and 'ty' numbers. We'd love for you to count with us at home too. In our circle we will count up saying numbers which come 'after' and count back, saying the number that would come 'before.'

In our The Snail and the Whale sentence builders write this week, we have thought about past-tense verbs to describe the storm and the waves calming down (e.g. settled, quietened) and how we might see our surroundings more clearly (e.g. I noticed, saw, spotted) as we move because of the sea (e.g. we are carried, lifted, heaved).


Forest school has given us an opportunity to be magical making brooms and wands and magically making nature grow by planting rows of plants to give a home and a food source for our local wildlife.

Around the rest of our learning, we have also managed to squeeze in a bit of time to practise the second half of the nativity for the first time! 













We have enjoyed listening to, reading and performing some nonsense poetry this week. The children were familiar with various poets including Micheal Rosen and Spike Milligan – poetry will be a continued focus in our whole class reading over the next few weeks. Please encourage your child to bring in any poetry books they would like to share with the class.

In Geography, we applied our developing knowledge of map symbols recognising different symbols on O/S maps that Mrs Clark brought into school – we were in awe of how big the maps were! We learnt about four figure and six figure grid references – if you have any O/S maps at home test your child's knowledge!

We have had two science lessons (catching up from our snow day) – testing different surfaces to observe the effect of friction on moving vehicles and grouping materials on the basis of magnetism. The children thoroughly enjoyed practical lessons and their collaborative working is fantastic – well done Magpies!

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Barn Owls this week have been working hard on our independent writing. We have been writing persuasive letters to eco activists to spread the message about climate change. We have written letters to David Attenborough, Greta Thunberg and more. We thought about persuasive techniques to get our message across- everyone has tried really hard all week and have produced high-quality letters.

In maths, we have been finishing our unit on multiplication and division. We have been focussing on long division, which has been tricky. We looked at different methods to help our understanding and then put these skills into use by completing some problem-solving and reasoning questions.

In computing, we continued to look making our websites. We discussed how using certain images could break copyright laws and learned the importance of seeking permission to use someone else's work. We explored how we could find copyright-free images we can use responsibly.

A big focus over the last few weeks in Barn Owls has been presentation in our books and making every piece of work one to be proud of. Everyone has put so much effort into this and it is evident to see in their books!

Next week in Barn Owls it is assessment week. Year 6 will complete another round of SATs practice papers, and Year 5 will tackle their PIRAs and PUMAs. These standardised tests will help identify key areas to focus on in future lessons.

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
