In Maths, we have been learning about addition and subtraction, exploring how we can use what we know from one calculation to help us with another.



Forest School is on Tuesdays—Please bring the following to change in to: wellies, water-proof coat & trousers.



Welcome back and Happy New Year!

Barn Owls have been predicting what will happen in our new whole-class reading book, Where the River Takes Us by Lesley Parr. We discovered that the story is set in the Welsh valleys, and the characters are on the hunt for a wild cat. We have met the characters and created profiles for each one based on how they act or what they say within the first chapter of the story.

We concluded our Science unit from the Autumn term about space by looking at craters and how they are formed. We performed an investigation to find out whether large meteorites create bigger craters than small meteorites or if the height from which they are dropped affects the size of the crater. The children worked really well in teams to conduct their investigations and recorded their results to show their findings.

In Art, we have started to look at Pablo Picasso. We explored different styles of art, including cubism and figurative art. We examined the features of each style and compared them to see how they are similar and different.

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
