In Kingfishers we have been looking at grouping and sharing, using the language lots of. Can you make groups of equal amounts at home and see how many lots of a number you can make? We've thought about what makes a number odd or even and linked this to our 2 times table. Our work on arrays has also developed into noticing multiplication is commutative.

RWInc is continuing as normal building confidence in red words, sounds and reading the focus stories. The whole class have finished their independent Dunsfordillo write stories this week, from our sentence builders work on 'The Gruffalo'. Those taking part in Sentence Stacking have been finishing their 'The Owl Who Was Afraid of the Dark' stories, using prepositions and lists, with commas, to give extra detail. They have moved onto their independent writes about their own animal.

In music we have used glockenspiels and in art we have completed our design compositions for our final miniature land art creations.

In English, the children have been busy planning their own explanation texts, drawing inspiration from the Romans, Boudicca, the invasion of Britain, and Londinium. 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denominators. The pupils have shown great enthusiasm in breaking down whole numbers into parts and grasping these new concepts.

The children have been experimenting with colour, shading, and mixing techniques to create beautiful pieces of art. Our Whole Class Reading sessions have been particularly fun this week as we've delved into playscripts and the classic tale of 'Jack and the Beanstalk'. The pupils have enjoyed exploring the characters, settings, and plot, bringing the story to life through their imaginative interpretations. It's been a fantastic week of learning and creativity!
