#### Realise the Possible: Forest School



What a wonderfully, busy last week of the spring term!


In English, we have been busy planning and writing our own sequels to the story The Blue Umbrella. We are using our creativity to develop new adventures for the characters.


#### **Stronger Together:** Office Communication Times


